Doug was an avid tennis fan and player spending as much time on the court as possible, building lifelong friendships along the way. He played in many state and regional tournaments ultimately winning the 2014 South Carolina State Championship for 55 and over mixed doubles. He was a member of many social clubs both in Burlington and Myrtle Beach including the Elks, Moose, and the Roma Club.

Anyone who knew him, loved and admired him. He was notoriously known for cracking jokes and pulling off pranks of all sorts, a friendly tease was a pure sign of affection. He will be dearly missed by all.
