

passed away on July 7, 2020. Virginia was a brilliant woman with a powerful mind who knew exactly how to light up the room. After she graduated from Loris High School in 1955, she went on to earn her bachelor's degree in Accounting from the University of South Carolina- Columbia. She became a Certified Public Accountant and owned her own business while she resided in Columbia, SC. Being the free spirit she was, she earned her pilot license and would fly across the country in her younger years. She moved from Columbia, SC to Long Island, NY where she resided for many years with her Husband Mr. Hedges, known to her family as "Bud". Her notable life experiences and accomplishments reached far beyond the United States. As a successful woman within the show dog industry, she and Mr. Hedges regularly traveled internationally. From her experience traveling to various countries, she had an abundance of knowledge and stories on the various cultures and societies that make our world so unique. After the passing of Mr. Hedges, she moved back to her hometown of Loris, SC where she took care of her mother, Ida Lewis, until she passed. She raised, groomed, trained, and boarded Norfolk Terriers- the canine breed which she adored. She had endless love for her animals and even created her own cemetery and memorials to honor them when they passed. Her love for her community was ever-present. She was a member of Cane Branch Baptist Church, where she was very involved and would volunteer in the kitchen for church events. Her compassion for others was abundantly clear in her years of volunteer service at Loris Community Hospital and the Loris Extended Care Center where she would bring gifts to lift the spirit of patients and their families. She was also a poll worker each election, showing her true patriotism and loyalty to her community, state, and country. When she was not volunteering her time to the community, she enjoyed eating at Shorty's Grill, visiting with friends and family, and spending time feeding the fish and turtles in the pond at her home.
