



## Wallace M. Booth

December 15, 1932 - November 11, 2020

Mr. Wallace Mack Booth, 87, a proud veteran and widower of the late Wilma Gerald Booth, passed away on Veterans Day, Wednesday, 11/11/2020, at Conway Manor, following an extended illness.

Born December 15, 1932 in Conway, he was the son of the late S. Mack Booth and the late Maude Graham Booth. Wallace was a loving husband and father, an excellent provider, and a man of his word. He was known for being full of humor and one who enjoyed family and life. He was of the Christian faith and a baptized member of Good Hope Baptist Church, where he served many years as a trustee. Wallace joined the Army National Guard at the age of 18 and served for 33 years, retiring as Master Sergeant. Also, he was employed with Santee Cooper, retiring as Right of Way Specialist after 34 years of service.

In addition to his loving wife of 69 years, Mr. Booth was predeceased by his daughter, Debbie Booth; his brothers, J. B. Booth and Julian Booth; his sisters, Ada Booth, Marvadean Hardee, and Juanita Small; and his son-in-law Larry Booth.

Survivors include his children, Phyllis Booth of Aynor, and Joan Booth of Conway; his grandchildren, Jerry Brian Hooks (Debra) of Everglades City, FL, Craig (Dana) Booth of Aynor, Trevor (Adrienne) Carroll of Wallace, NC, and Drake (Ashley) Carroll, and Collin (Ashley) Fleenor, all of Conway; and eight great-grandchildren; and a special nephew, Mike Hardee of Conway.
