



Abdul M. Rahmani

November 10, 1943 - November 26, 2008

Raleigh, NC—Abdul M. Rahmani, 65, passed away on November 26, 2008 after an extended illness. He was born on November 10, 1943, in the village of Ramack, province of Ghazni, Afghanistan, his beloved homeland. He came to the United States in 1963 to attend North Carolina State University on an engineering scholarship. He distinguished himself academically, and received undergraduate and graduate degrees in mechanical engineering from NC State. During his years as a student at State, he came to love the USA, his adopted hometown of Raleigh and his alma mater. He proudly became an American citizen and began an engineering career that would first benefit the city of Raleigh and soon thereafter the entire state of NC. For the bulk of his career, he supervised and coordinated bridge-design work for the North Carolina Department of Transportation. His last assignment prior to retirement in 2004 was as a consulting engineer with the NC Flood Plain Mapping Program, a unique joint effort by state and federal emergency management agencies to improve preparedness and decrease the likelihood of devastating flooding in North Carolina. Throughout his career, he dedicated himself to both rendering the highest quality engineering services and being a responsible steward of the state's tax dollars as he made decisions on bridge design projects across North Carolina.

Beyond his work, Abdul's other passions included loyally supporting NC State Wolfpack athletics and enjoying time with his beloved wife at their vacation

home in Holden Beach, NC.

Abdul is survived by his devoted wife of 23 years, Carol H. Rahmani. In addition, he is survived by his brother A. Fattah Rahmani of Norway; brothers A. Ghaffar Rahmani and A. Quassim Rahmani, and sister Saliha Rahmani of Afghanistan; and brother-in-law Robert Chester Hipp and his wife Brenda of Loris, SC.

The family will receive visitors at Brown-Wynne Funeral Home, 200 SE Maynard Rd., Cary, NC, from 6:00 to 8:00 PM on Friday, November 28, 2008. A funeral service and celebration of Abdul's life will be held at the Loris First United Methodist Church, 3507 Broad St., Loris, SC, on Sunday, November 30, 2008 at 2:00 PM. The Reverend Russell Freeman will officiate. Interment will follow at Twin City Memorial Gardens.

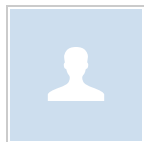
