He was a US Army Veteran of WWII, having served with the 2nd Infantry Division, was in the Battle of the Bulge and the D-Day Invasion. After 33 years of service, Mr. Altman retired in 1987 as the Veterans Service Officer of Horry County. He was a retired farmer and was predeceased by his wife Mary Catherine McCarrel Altman.
