Captain Alex Sing, Jr. age 75 of Colony Court died Wednesday, March 9, 2005 at Waccamaw Community Hospital. Born November 22, 1929 in Murrells Inlet, he was the son of the late Alex and Minnie Singleton Sing. Mr. Sing was a US Navy veteran serving on the Carrier USS Boxer in the Korean Conflict.
