Allen Nesbit Simmons of Surfside Beach died Saturday, June 28, 2008. He was born September 21, 1924 in North Bennington, VT, a son of the late Herman Mclane Jack Simmons and Marcia Allen Simmons. Mr. Simmons graduated from the University of Vermont with a BS degree in Mechanical Engineering. He served 3 years in the US Army and was a veteran of World War II, serving with the Glider Troops in France, the Air Force Cadet Program. He attended Catawba College in Salisbury, NC and retired after 33 years with Union Carbide Corporation as an Engineering Manager, living in New York, Ohio, Tennessee and West Virginia. Mr. Simmons was a member of the American Legion, VFW, Masonic Lodge, Moose Club and a licensed Professional Engineer in Ohio and Tennessee. He was a nine gallon blood donor and ran The Red Cross Program in Tennessee, and was a licensed Episcopalian Lay Reader in Tennessee and West Virginia and led the start up of a new Episcopal Church in Lawrenceburg, TN. Mr. Simmons was an avid golfer and was proud to have designed and built the first log cabin home in Surfside Beach, having done much of the later construction himself. He was preceded in death by his loving wife, Carolyn Anne Quance Simmons and his fiancée of 11 years, Jean B. Alexander. Surviving are two daughters, Nancy Anne Crossman and husband Daryl, with grandchildren Nicholas and Kyra of Sandwich, Cape Cod, Mass. and Sally Anne Wilson and husband Randolph, with granddaughter Emily Anne of Myrtle Beach, SC, a twin brother, Arthur C. Simmons and his wife, Therese. A memorial service will be held 2:00 PM,
