Alpha Omega Larrimore Wiggins Schultz entered the presence of the Lord on January 29, 2025. She passed away at home, surrounded by her family and caregivers.

Born February 4, 1925, in Marion County, SC, Ms. Schultz was the daughter of the late

Alpha's professional journey would take her to Washington, DC. Based at the Pentagon,
she served as a Management Analyst for the Department of Defense, US Army,
supporting civilian and military manpower management. She retired following thirty-
seven years in the Federal Civil Service, receiving numerous commendations and
awards during those years of service. She would remain an active member of the
National Active and Retired Federal Employees (NARFE). It would be a tremendous
understatement to say that she was a trailblazer.

At the conclusion of her professional career, Alpha returned to the low country of South
Carolina where she spent many years enjoying her family, her church and her community. Having experienced an incredibly full life, just days short of a century, Alpha
relished being able to maintain an independent life in her beloved Pawleys Island home,
with the assistance of her cherished caregivers, Joe and Lucy Humes. As in all aspects
of her life, she would approach her final days with faith and the same determination that
had always served her so well. She will be remembered as a beautiful, intellectual, self-
determined lady who led an uncommonly extraordinary life.
