Andrew "Smitty" McCulloch Smith, age 87 of Hagwood Circle and formerly of Elmwood Park, New Jersey died Sunday, December 9, 2007 at Conway Medical Center following an illness. Mr. Smith was born in Quincy, Massachusetts, a son of the late Patrick and Jane McCulloch Smith. He was a US Merchant Marine Veteran of World War II and was a member and instructor with the Coast Guard Auxiliary. Mr. Smith was an avid boater. Prior to retirement, he was employed by Breyers Ice Cream Company and also had been employed by Conway Chrysler Dodge Jeep. Mr. Smith was predeceased by a daughter, Patricia Smith. He was of the Catholic faith. Surviving are: one daughter, Bonnie Smith Hughes and her husband Steve of Conway; one grand daughter, Debra Smith Girgenti and her husband Tommy of Saddle Brook, New Jersey; two step grandchildren, Dawn Warman and her husband Dan of Dover, Delaware, Shawn Hughes and his wife Diana of Conway; four step great grand daughters, Jessica Warman, Ashlie, Warman, Syndi Warman and Alexa Hughes; two special nieces, Kathleen Grauson and Rose Smith; special friend, Roena "Toots" Vaught; and several nieces, nephews, and in-laws. “ Smitty was a special part of our family. It's so hard to accept that he will not be with us at Christmas as he's always been. Last year he was so sweet and patient as Alexa repeatedly sang the songs from her Christmas program. He loved how she started each one...1, 2, 3... The night before Smitty passed away we went to visit him at the hospital and Alexa performed this year's Christmas songs for Dot and Al and Smitty. Smitty was resting peacefully, but I know he was smiling inside as "the baby" sang to him. He referred to Alexa now 4 years old as "the baby" because he could never remember her name. We brought Smitty's Christmas card to him at the hospital and hung it so he could see Alexa's picture on it. It means a lot to me that he was so proud of her that he told the nurses that she was his granddaughter. Last fall we visited Smitty at CMC and he won Alexa's heart by giving her his strawberries. Anytime we spoke of Smitty Alexa would say "I love Smitty...he's so nice". For many years Smitty would drive me to the airport anytime I traveled to NJ. If he picked me up from the airport he'd insist on taking me to lunch. The funniest time was when he was supposed to pick me up at my house at 9:30 and take me to airport. He walked passed Shawn in the shop around 9:45 and Shawn said you're back already from the airport? Smitty yelled sh*# and took off for his van. He had forgotten. That was probably the only time he was ever late. If he told you he'd come by at 11:00 he'd be there by 10:30. When he and Shawn went to Wilmington to visit the ship in February he was in our driveway 45 minutes early ready to go. We enjoyed going out to eat with Smitty and spending time with Smitty. Most of all I loved to witness the relationship Shawn and Smitty had. They would go to boat shows each year and shared the dream of owning those fancy yachts. They went to Charleston and Wilmington where Smitty was like a kid in a candy store. He taught Shawn all about the ships and told him stories about the war like they were yesterday. Smitty shared a little of his wood working expertise with Shawn when they built the work bench in our garage. Along with Steve they put up a fence to keep Dallas in our yard. Watching the three of them "work together" I'm surprised it's still standing 6 years later. It was so nice to see how much Smitty and Shawn loved each other. They'd do

anything for eachother. They had so much fun spending time together. We'd go out on Smitty's boat and I still have to laugh when I picture him with sunscreen all over his face and head...not rubbed in at all... there's Smitty with a totally white head and face. Smitty was such a sweet man. Last February my dad was visiting from NJ and Smitty was in the hospital so dad and I went to visit him. My father had a triple bypass a few months before and that was the first time Smitty had seen him since. Here's Smitty lying in the hospital bed and he's asking my dad how he's feeling. 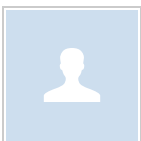
