Anne filled her life and the lives of those who loved her with fun, humor and positivity. She conveyed her passions to daughters Lisa (Educator and Author in Los Angeles) and Julia (Theatre Director in London) in a big beautiful Lannon Stone house just outside Chicago in River Forest, Illinois, which she curated, as one of Julia's teenage friends put it, "like the most eccentric and wonderful museum." Her daughters survive her along with Larry, her loving husband of 36 years.
