February 22, 1942 - January 27, 2021

Anthony (Tony) Francis Dominick, Jr., age 78, passed away on Wednesday, January 27, 2021 from pancreatic cancer.

Born on February 22nd, 1942, he was a son of the late Anthony Francis and Elizabeth Patricia Dominick.

Tony graduated from St. Mary's High School in Annapolis, MD and joined the Air Force. He worked in food service from many years, including the Rayburn Building in Washington D.C., and he retired as a Food Service Manager at the University of Maryland. Tony was active in the Sons and Daughters of Italy Lodge 2662 since 2012, the Elks Lodge 2266 for 51 years, the American Legion Post 40 for 8 years after transferring from Maryland and the Surfside Moose Lodge. He loved his family, the beach, fishing, and was an avid sports fan. He played football in high school and competed in darts and bowling. He was even-tempered, humorous, and a great friend.

Survivors include his wife of 29 years, Phyllis White Dominick; children, Lori Annette Dominick of Greenbelt, MD, Anthony Francis Dominick III of Baltimore, MD, Kimberly Michelle Dominick and her husband Scott Shores of Cambridge, MD, stepchildren Tom Swartz of Easton, MD and Maria Swartz of Annapolis, MD; 4 grandchildren; siblings, Patty Dominick of Lititz, PA, Mary Morin and husband Jim of Severna Park, MD, Frank Dominick of Frostproof,

After graduating from language school, we moved on to Goodfellow AFB in San Angelo, TX for airborne intercept operator training, which lasted for six months and I can recall some bleary, fun-filled nights in the C&W bars of San Angelo that we enjoyed. Following tech school, we were both assigned to duty at Eielson AFB near Fairbanks, AK, where we shared some hair-raising experiences as aircrew members on RC-135 reconnaissance missions over the Arctic Ocean.
