She was past president and active member of the Camellia Garden Club. She was a Girl Scout leader for her daughter, Joanne, and her friends, taking them all

the way to the highest level, Curved Bar Status. Mrs. Crowgey was also a longtime member of her beloved Sewing Club. Mrs. Crowgey was predeceased by a son, Billy Crowgey, a half brother, Jim Wainwright and a sister in law, Virginia Snider of Roanoke, VA. She was a lady who was loved by all, because she gave love and friendship to everyone with whom she came in contact. She never had a harsh word to say about anyone. She was the sunshine of our lives.
