Murrells Inlet Betty Jo Sing, 70, of Macklen Avenue, died Tuesday, January 16, 2007 at her residence. Mrs. Sing was born September, 28, 1936 in Horry County a daughter of the late A.P. and Myrtle Parker Johnson. Betty Jo called Murrells Inlet home for more than fifty years and was instrumental in the formation of the fishing village. Along with the late Alex Sing, Jr., they opened Captain Alex Marina and featured the first one-day fishing trip to the Gulf Stream aboard the Captain Alex. She also opened Inlet Port Marina and offered a modern boat ramp for easy access to the inlet for area fisherman. Later she established the Glass Etching Co. of S.C. providing decorative glass etching. Her work can be seen throughout the Grand Strand. Survivors include children, Teresa Tweedy, Jennifer Sing Bottomley, Sandra Bundy, John "Alex" Sing; grandchildren, Donald Altman Jr., Willie Tweedy, Alana, Joshua, Justin and Austin Sing; and siblings, Barbara Hussey, A.P. Johnson, Jackie Williamson, and Buddy Johnson. A memorial service will be held 10:00 AM, Saturday, January 20, 2007 at Goldfinch Funeral Home, Beach Chapel. Visitation to follow at the family home.
