Beulah Glenn Reeves McCain of Murrells Inlet, S.C., passed away at the University of North Carolina Hospital in Chapel Hill, N.C. at the age of 86. She was born on April 17, 1924 in Atlanta, Georgia, and was the only child of the late Hiram Wyatt Reeves and Bessie Glendora Bridwell.
