



## Bonnie Hendrick

January 28, 1925 - January 18, 2016

Mrs. Bonnie Hendrick, 90, widow of the late Eason Hendrick, passed away peacefully at her home on Monday, January 18, 2016.

Born January 28, 1925 in Awendaw, SC she was the daughter of the late George Edward Player and the late Eliza Mozelle Cumbee Player. Mrs. Hendrick was a member of First Baptist Church of Conway where she faithfully shared her floral talents for more than 50 years, providing arrangements for Worship Services and special events. Mrs. Hendrick was also a former member and past president of the Pilot Club. Mrs. Hendrick was a charter member of the Iris Garden Club and remained active in the club for 65 years. The City of Conway proclaimed November 16, 2000 as "Bonnie Hendrick Day" in Conway, and in 2001 Mrs. Hendrick was awarded the "Mrs. Wilbur R. Chandler Award #13". She was also a member of the Order of the Eastern Star and served as Worthy Matron in 1960-1961. Mrs. Hendrick was the manager and buyer for The Children Shop in Conway. She was predeceased by her husband of 61 years, Eason Hendrick; her brother, Guyton Player; and her sisters, Phyllis Glines, Eva Mae Thweatt, Hattie Powell, and Aileen Newkirk.

Mrs. Hendrick is survived by her daughters, Pat (Roger) Haley, Brenda Hendrick, and Ginger (Sammy) McCullar; her grandchildren, Scarlett Haley, Jarrett Haley, Allison Tyner, and Hendrick McCullar; her great-grandchildren,

Cole Tyner, Hunter Tyner, Eason Haley, and Hulse Haley; her brother, Edward Player; and her sister, Georgette Wilson.

*She was a truly beautiful woman -a treasure to all who knew her and loved her.*

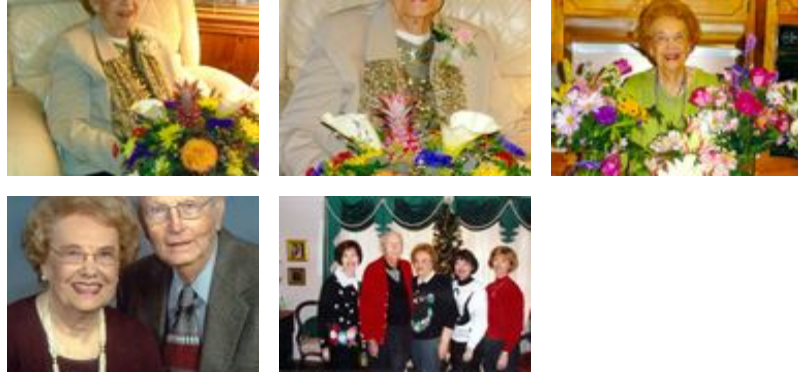
