Brenda Annette Stout, age 58, of Myrtle Beach, S.C., passed away on Sunday, January 29, 2023 in her home. Brenda was a beloved wife to her husband, a loving mother to her two children, and the best granny to her four granddaughters.

Brenda was born in Frederick, Maryland, on January 15, 1965, a daughter to Patty and Ray Davis, who precede her in death. Brenda met her husband, John A. Stout, Jr., in 1986. 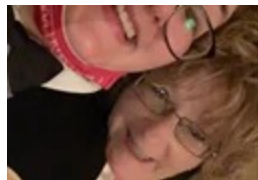
