Murrells Inlet Byron Jackson "Jack" Warder, age 81 of Captains Cove died Saturday, December 31, 2005 at his home. Born May 28, 1924 in Fairmont, WV, he was the son of the late Byron and Pauline Warder. He was a 1950 graduate from WV University with a degree in Forestry. He began his career with the State of WV in the Dept. of Natural Resources. He held the position of Service Forester, District Forester, Assistant State Forester until his appointment as State Forester in 1981. Mr. Warder retired in 1986 and moved to Murrells Inlet. He was also a member of the WV Air National Guard and retired in 1973 at the rank of Colonel. Mr. Warder was a member of Holy Cross Faith Memorial Episcopal Church in Pawleys Island. He was preceded in death by his daughter, Mary E. Warder Jones in 2001. Surviving are his wife, Ellen T. Warder; sons, Paul S. Warder and wife Bobbi of Charleston, WV and John M. Warder of St. Albans, WV; grandson, Jonathan of St. Albans and by his former wife, the mother of his children, Virginia S. Reynolds. Services will be 1:00 PM, Wednesday at Goldfinch Funeral Home, Beach Chapel with visitation one hour prior to services. A reception following the services will be at the Captains Cove Club House.
