



## Carlon Hutchinson

January 9, 1925 - November 22, 2013

Carlon Genair Hutchinson, 88, of Conway, died Friday, November 22, 2013 at Conway Medical Center.

Born in the Floyds Township of Horry County, Nichols, SC on January 9, 1925, Genair was a son of the late George Layton and Helen Valva Gerrald Hutchinson. He graduated from Floyds High School in 1942, and was a graduate of Clemson University where he received his B.S., Masters, and EDS degrees. He served his country honorably in the U.S. Navy during WW II, stationed for three years in the Aleutian Islands. Mr. Hutchinson began his professional career at Conway High School as the Agriculture and Horticulture teacher where he taught for 22 years. He remained with the Horry County Department of Education from 1951 through 1988. He was a loyal, dedicated, and passionate teacher and school administrator, always striving to positively impact and shape the lives of young people through education and personal interest. He was an adored educator and a friend to all who knew him.

Mr. Hutchinson was a strong believer in prayer and liked to begin his days in a quiet, reflective manner. A proud member of the Future Farmers of America, he always looked forward to accompanying the local FFA Chapter and President to the annual National Convention in Kansas City, Missouri where they were recognized with numerous honors. He graciously received the Honorary State Farmer Degree in 1968 from the Future Farmers of America. He later served as President of the S.C. Vocational Agriculture Teacher's Association, 1970-1971. He supervised the construction of the Grand Strand

Career Center and served as its first Director. In 1988 he was presented an award for Outstanding Contribution and Dedication by the S.C. Vocational Directors Association. He was also presented an award for his years of dedicated service to the Aynor-Conway Career Center by the faculty and staff. Mr. Hutchinson always said teaching was a work of heart.

After his retirement, he continued to be active in the school system, serving as a substitute teacher at Conway High School for several years. Mr. Hutchinson was a Mason, Honorary Kiwanian and former Jaycee. In the community, Mr. Hutchinson was a member of the First United Methodist Church in Conway, where he served as an usher, was on the Council on Ministries, a Past Chairman and member of the Administrative Board and the Finance Committee, he also served on the Building Committee. He was an active member of the John McCutcheon Sunday School Class for over 50 years, having served twice as President, and was also a past member of the Methodist Men's Club.

Genair was a man of honor, integrity, faith and family. His greatest joy was to fulfill special wishes for his family and his students, both of which he held dear to his heart. He will always be remembered as one who remained true to his principles. He was an avid gardener and enjoyed sharing his harvest with neighbors and friends. Throughout his 45 year career, he always showed his love for all the students with whom he came in contact, they brought deep joy to his life. Each year he anonymously provided funds for students who needed help in order to have a hot lunch at school. This was his private ministry to which he remained dedicated. His greatest love was enjoying the accomplishments of his students who are now ministers, lawyers, farmers, doctors, teachers, nurses, college professors, business owners and government officials.

He was predeceased in death by his wife Sadie Rae Hutchinson. Survivors include his son Al L. Hutchinson and wife Rita of Pawleys Island, SC.; two granddaughters Tara Clemmons and husband Steve of Longs, SC, and Tawnya Sherer and husband Duncan of Myrtle Beach, SC; three great-

grandchildren, Harrison, Carter and Taylor. He is also survived by one brother, Roger L. Hutchinson and wife Von of New Port Richie, FL. Four sisters, Izora Marlowe of Wilmington, NC, Elowise Anderson and husband Jenks of Matthews, NC, Miriam Hovis and husband John of Clover, SC and Rebecca Taylor of Perryburg, OH, and several nieces and nephews. He was predeceased by one sister, Corinne Stubbs and one brother, George Hutchinson, Jr.

Funeral services will be held Monday, November 25, 2013 at 2:00 PM at the First United Methodist Church in Conway with Rev. Kyle Randle officiating. Entombment will follow in Hillcrest Mausoleum.

The family will receive friends one hour prior to the service in the church commons on Monday.
