GARDEN CITY BEACH | Carroll Edwin Caverly Jr., 80, died Tuesday, August 14, 2007. Born December 9, 1926 in Baltimore, Maryland, he was the son of the late Carroll Edwin Caverly Sr. and the late Grace Staines Caverly. Carroll was a World War II veteran of the U.S. Navy, serving both stateside and in the South Pacific. A member of Belin United Methodist Church, he was an active volunteer in the early famous Belin Bar-B-Que. Mr. Caverly retired as a clerk from the U.S. Postal Service in Myrtle Beach after 30 years of service. He had also served as a Sunday school teacher for more than 20 years. Mr. Caverly is survived by his wife, Pauline Cox Caverly, of Garden City Beach; one brother, Eddie Caverly of Tuscon, Ariz.; two sisters, Margaret Hamil and Joan Chandler, both of Baltimore, Md.; and a number of nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his parents and two brothers, John Earl Caverly and Bobby Caverly. Funeral services will be held at 4 p.m. Thursday, August 16, 2007, at Belin United Methodist Church. The Rev. Dr. B. Mike Alexander Jr. will officiate. Visitation will be held from 6 until 8 p.m. Wednesday, August 15, 2007, at the funeral home.
