C. Lee Millin, 63, of Myrtle Beach, SC, formerly of Malvern, PA, was received into the Church Triumphant on Wednesday, March 27 following a short illness due to complications from cancer. He was the son of the late J. Chalmers Millin and Jane Kirk Millin. Lee graduated from Fairmont High School, Fairmont, WV in 1967 and The Pennsylvania State University in 1972. His career for 34 years was in Marketing with Armstrong World Industries, Architectural Building Products Division. Following that, he worked 4 years for Kamco Building Supply in Chester, PA. He retired to Myrtle Beach, SC in 2011. Lee is survived by his wife Sue, two daughters, Melissa Reynold and Meghan Williams, and four adorable grandchildren. Lee loved to play golf and in retirement realized a dream of playing twice a week. He was also passionate about anything connected to his alma mater, Penn State. There will be a service celebrating his life at First Presbyterian Church in Myrtle Beach on Monday, April 8 at 1:00 p.m. and also at Covenant Presbyterian Church, Malvern, PA on Friday, April 26 at 11:00 a.m.

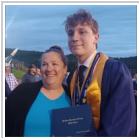
