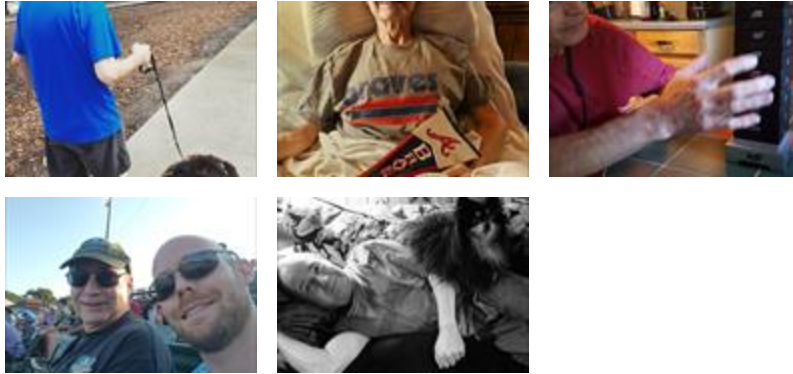
A remembrance service will be held at a later date, and in lieu of flowers, you can make a donation to the American Stroke Association.
