



Chester L. "Lee" Eaddy Jr.

September 4, 1965 - April 18, 2026

Lee Eaddy, age 60, passed away on April 18, 2026 at Conway Medical Center with his mother at his side. After avoiding COVID for over six years, he tested positive on March 30 and four days later was in ICU with pneumonia which he fought for two weeks before losing the battle.

Born September 4, 1965 in Charleston, Lee was the son of Paulette Brown Eaddy Gujer and the late Chester L. Eaddy, Sr. He lived in Conway from the time he was a week old, and spent the last eight years in the same house where he lived his first ten.

Lee was a graduate of Conway High School, where he was on the football and wrestling teams. He was a very talented artist who filled page after page with super heroes of the day. It was during that time that he developed a great love for tennis, and some years later played on local teams as well as many tournaments across the state.

When he could no longer play, Lee still enjoyed watching tennis on TV as well as the Braves baseball games. But most of all, he was a huge Gamecock football fan, even when his team had a bad year. He enjoyed working out at Planet Fitness and Saturday night suppers at his Mom's house.

After high school, Lee attended Coastal Carolina College, and received a

Diploma in Drafting and an Associate's degree in civil engineering from Horry-Georgetown Technical College.

Surviving in addition to his mother of Aynor are his sister, Angela Eaddy Lee (Tim); nephew, Jayson Lee (Summer); great niece, Diana Lee; several aunts and cousins and a very special aunt, Clara Nell Brown, who loved him so much.

A memorial service will be held at a later date.
