Clinton Edward Marshall passed peacefully in his sleep on Saturday July 16, 2016 at Grand Strand Healthcare in Socasstee.

Born in August of 1923 in Hudson, New York, Clinton was a World War II veteran who served his country in the Coast Guard. In the fall of 2011 he was fortunate enough to take an Honor Flight from Myrtle Beach to Washington, DC. There the veterans toured the memorials and were honored for their service. The day prior to his passing he again was honored with the presentation of a Quilt of Valor.

Clinton is survived by his daughter, Carol J. Speranzella, and her husband, Mike Speranzella, Clinton's two sons, Clinton C. Marshall, Timothy D.
