Dr. Constantine G. "Charles" Kyreages age 92, died Monday, September 8, 2014 at Waccamaw Community Hospital.

Born in Dover, NH, he was a son of the late George and Anna Kyreages. Dr. Kyreages was a U.S. Army veteran of the Battle of The Buldge, and served with the 26th Infantry Division. He was a graduate of the University of N. Hampshire where he was a member of the Yankee Division and a graduate of Temple Medical School in Philadelphia, PA. He had 35 years of medical service between Allegheny General Hospital in Pittsburgh, PA and Passavant Hospital in N. Hills, PA. Dr. Kyreages was a member of Allegheny County Medical Society in PA, a member of Medical Society, American Medical Association and a member of Surfside Presbyterian Church. He was preceded in death by brothers, Demo Kyreages and Lt. Col. Elias Kyreages, and a sister, Ethel Schweitzer.

Survivors include his loving wife of 57 years, Nellie Kyreages of Surfside Beach; 2 daughters, Charlene K. Henderson and her husband Gregory of Surfside Beach and Diane K.
