David Lee Johnson, a proud veteran of the US military intelligence officer, passed away on November 5 at Myrtle Beach. He was born on September 29, 1944, in Minneapolis, Minnesota, where he graduated from the University of Minnesota with a BA/Master's degree.

David's intellectual curiosity and knowledge of science, technology, and modern affairs were unparalleled. He was a polyglot fluent in German, French, Spanish, Greek, Italian, Russian, Japanese, Chinese, and Korean. David was a passionate rocker, a classical musician, and a master flamenco guitar player.
