Dinah enjoyed meeting and talking with people, was an avid reader and loved

word puzzles. Old western tv shows and movies were her passion. She loved

country twice by motor coach spending several months exploring the states. She enjoyed boating even though she never learned to swim and she had a mischievous sense of humor that entertained those around her. Dinah had several hundred cook books and loved trying new recipes and perfecting old ones. Her grandchildren have fond memories of visiting her and grandpa Dave's mountain home in N.C. and riding ATV's around the countryside. They also loved Grandma Dinah's cooking. They were amazed by the fact that Grandma Dinah at 5'5" could drive their 40 ft. motor home through mountain roads! There were many great family times at their home on Lake Okeechobee and vacations spent together in Myrtle Beach.
