Douglas Alan Bain, Sr., 81, entered into rest on October 31, 2024, at his home in Conway, SC. He was the beloved husband of Beverly A. Bain. Doug was born in Baltimore, MD on December 18, 1942 to Fillmore and Mildred (Hahn) Bain.

Doug attended Harding High in Bridgeport, CT and Michigan Tech, graduating with a master's degree in metallurgical engineering. He completed ROTC training in 1966 and served in Germany as a Lieutenant in the U.S. Army. From 1968-2001, he held various positions working his way up the managerial chain at Anaconda American Brass, Waterbury, CT, later known as Ansonia Copper and Brass, Ansonia, CT. He was a member ASTM and ASM, and received several awards including the Copper Club award for recognition of outstanding work in leadership and achievements in copper testing standards.

Doug was an avid sportsman who enjoyed camping, fishing, and hunting with his brothers, sons, and grandsons. He enjoyed gardening, tinkering with his 1936 dump truck, woodworking, and stained glass projects. He single handedly built a horse barn and large addition to his home in Woodbury, CT, later remodeling several homes.

Doug married Beverly Ann Saffo in 1990 and they enjoyed traveling, gardening, antiquing, and having weekend barn sales at their home in

Trumbull, CT. Doug and Bev later retired to Conway, SC, making wonderful memories and new friends.

Doug is also survived by his sons Doug Bain, Jr., Eric Bain and Nina Moran; grandsons, Ethan, Grayden, and Simon Bain; nephews, Tim (Kristin V.) Bain, Michael (Kristin A.) Bain; former spouse and mother of his children, Joyce Yeomans; and lifelong friends Len and Lorna Berger.

He is predeceased by his youngest son, Peter; brothers, Fillmore and Nelson Bain; and good friend Tim Burke.
