Dr. W.R. Griffin, age 81, of Burroughs Street, died Thursday, January 27, 2005 at Conway Medical Center. Dr. Griffin was born February 6, 1923, in Rock Hill, SC, a son of the late Marcellus and Hattie Griffin. He was a member of the First United Methodist Church and served on the administrative board. Dr. Griffin was a graduate of the College of Charleston and the Medical College of South Carolina. He served on the US Naval Medical Corp, practiced in Laurinburg, NC and moved to Conway in 1958 where he practiced obstetrics and gynecology. Dr. Griffin served on the Conway Hospital Board of Trustees and was a director of People's Federal Savings & Loan and First Federal of Charleston. He was a member of the Dunes Golf and Beach Club. Surviving are his wife Betty Anne Smith Griffin of Conway; two daughters Betty Anne Sloan and her husband Rus of Marion, SC and Mary Charles Conner and her husband Dr. Bill Conner of Rome, GA; one son Robert Griffin, Jr. of Murrells Inlet; granddaughters Anne and Sarah Sloan, Gabbe' and Kyzer Griffin; grandsons Stephen and Charles Conner. Funeral services will be held 11:00 AM Saturday from the First United Methodist Church of Conway with Rev. Thomas Britton and Rev. Ben Barnett officiating. Burial will follow in Lakeside Cemetery, directed by Goldfinch Funeral Home, Conway Chapel. The family will receive friends from 5-7 PM Friday at the funeral home. 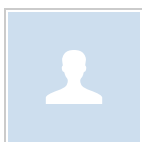
