Edward Allen Crawford of Rose Run passed away peacefully at the Lakes of Litchfield on May 10, 2026.

Known as Eddy, he was born on December 18, 1940 in Dayton, TN. He was the son of late Robert and Ruth Crawford and he was predeceased by his pharmacist brother "Doc" J. Robert Crawford. He is survived by his longtime girlfriend "honey-bunny" as he called her, MaryJane.

He was drafted into the US Army during the Vietnam war and was a sharpshooter. His career took him to Alexandria, VA with the then Bell Atlantic (now Verizon) from working the poles to promotion to outside supervisor & trainer. He loved the Washington Commanders.
