Edward Linwood Harrison age 68, died Saturday, July 1, 2017 at his residence.

Born in Lost Creek, WV, he was a son of the late Russell and Reba Harrison. Ed greatly admired the services rendered by the Knights of Columbus and dedicated 28 years to their cause. He rose to become the Grand Knight of the Council at St. James in Conway and Faithful Navigator of its 4th Degree Assembly.
