Dr. Elizabeth Regina Eline, age 53, a resident of the International Club, Murrells Inlet, SC died Sunday, March 23, 2014 at her home.

Born in Upper Darby, PA, she was the daughter of Elizabeth E. Eline of Murrells Inlet and the late Eugene A. Eline Sr. Dr. Eline attended Pope Paul VI High School in Haddon Township, NJ. She graduated from Camden County College in Blackwood, NJ. She received a degree in Biology from LaSalle University in Philadelphia, PA. She attended the Philadelphia College of Podiatric Medicine in Philadelphia, PA and earned the degree of Doctor of Podiatric Medicine. She completed post-graduate surgical training at Frankford Hospital in Philadelphia, PA. Her podiatry practice was in Philadelphia, PA and Seguin, TX. Later in life she obtained a Masters Degree in Theology from Holos University Graduate Seminary. She was a very spiritual person and her greatest joy in life was her son.
