Born March 16, 1925 in Takoma Park, MD he was the son of the late William T. and Edna Seek Bonifant. "Bill" was a decorated United States Navy Veteran of WWII serving aboard the USS Santee Air craft carrier. He fought in both the European and Pacific campaigns and was awarded the Presidential Unit Citation for "For extraordinary heroism in action against enemy forces in the air, ashore and afloat. He was admired and loved by all his family and friends. "Bill" was predeceased by his wife, Lorraine Helen Bonifant, and his two sons, Bruce Eugene Bonifant and Stephen Allen Bonifant. "Bill" is survived by his beloved daughter, Christine Holford and her husband Bond L. Holford, Jr. of Murrells Inlet; granddaughter Candace A. Daugherty of Myrtle Beach; Grandson John Edward Coleman, Jr. of Myrtle Beach; great granddaughter Shannon Halvelka; sister Vera Preddy of Virginia; brother Paul Bonifant of Maryland; brother -in -law Joseph V.
