Everett L. Clark Myrtle Beach Everett L. Clark age 79 of Lands End Blvd. died November 28, 2008 at National Health Care-Garden City. Born July 3, 1929 in Oklahoma, he was the son of Sam and Marguerite Clark. Mr. Clark moved to Myrtle Beach, SC from Nashua, NH in 2003. He was known for his infectious smile and easy going manner. He was an avid outdoorsman and loved fishing, boating, hunting, and swimming, and enjoyed old movies and reading. Mr. Clark entered the Army Air Corp in 1946 at the age of 16 and worked his way to Chief Master Sergeant in the Air Force. He was in the post World War II reconstruction, the Berlin Airlift, two tours at the American Embassy in Belgrade Yugoslavia, and a Vietnam Veteran. He retired from the military in 1974 and went to work with Nashua Corp. in Nashua New Hampshire until his 2nd retirement in the late 80's. Mr. Clark was preceded in death by his wife Hildegard E. Clark. Surviving are his son, Mark Clark and wife Molly of New Hampshire; step grandson, Robert Bergemann of New Hampshire; and sister-in-law, Edith Richter of Germany. Services will be held at 11:00 A.M. Monday, March 23, 2009 at Arlington National Cemetery.
