Mr. Frank H. Alexander died Sunday , June 19, 2005 at Grand Strand Regional Medical Center following a brief illness Mr. Alexander was born in Marlin , Texas on May 5, 1920 to the late Samuel and Mittie C. Alexander . He served in the U.S. Army , the U.S. Army Air Corps, and the U.S. Air Force , for a total of thirty years where he trained pilots. He retired from the U.S. Air Force in 1972. His esteemed military service record includes service during WWII, The Korean War , and the Vietnam War. A prolific student, he attended Southern Methodist University on a football scholarship, University of Omaha, Middle Tennessee State, University of Tennessee, University of Hawaii , Coastal Carolina College and Horry/Georgetown Technical College where he earned several degrees Mr. Alexander was a devoted thirty second degree Mason in the Masonic Order. He was a member of Marlin, Texas and Tokyo, Japan lodges for over fifty years. He was also a Shriner and was a member of Omar Temple Shrine of South Carolina . He loved to fly as a Pilot and to teach others to fly as well. Surviving are his loving wife Jo Alice Alexander, a son Edward J. Alexander and a daughter Mitty J. Alexander .
