CONWAY.....Frederick "Fred" J. Jannett, Sr. died Friday, January 7, 2005 at Conway Medical Center. Mr. Jannett was born in Newark, New Jersey, a son of the late Frederick A. and Marie Frances Wisniewski Jannett. He was educated in the Union Township, NJ schools. Mr. Jannett received his Associate Degree in Mechanical Engineering from Newark Institute of Technology and his BS and MS degrees in Mechanical Engineering from the New Jersey Institute of Technology. Mr. Jannett was a US Navy and Marine Corp Veteran of World War II. He received his Naval Aviator Wings at Pensacola Naval Air Station in December of 1943. He was a naval flight instructor and fighter pilot. He retired from the Marine Corp reserves in 1958. Mr. Jannett was formerly a Design Engineer with American Can Company and an evening instructor at the Newark/Essex County Vocational School System. He then was an Engineering Manager with RCA Equipment Development in Harrison, NJ. He retired from Western Electric Research Center in Princeton, NJ as a research Supervisor. Mr. Jannett held many patents and was a licensed private and commercial pilot. He moved from Basking Ridge, NJ to Conway in October 1988. Mr. Jannett was a member of St. James Catholic Church of Conway and Knights of Columbus Council 7531. Surviving are his wife of 61 years, Marion W. Jannett, Conway; one son, Frederick J. Jannett, Jr. PHD and his wife Janice of St. Paul, MN; one sister, Greta McDermott and her husband Joe of McMichaels, PA; and one brother, Ernest A. Jannett of Linden, NJ. A funeral mass will be said at 11:00 AM Tuesday from St. James

Catholic Church with Father John Silver officiating. Burial will be at a later date in Gate of Heaven Cemetery in East Hanover, NJ.
