He worked on the boardwalk a few blocks from his home in Keansburg, a popular waterfront resort in NJ. It became instilled into his way of life, and was contagious. He went on to manage Gynn Oak Park in Baltimore, MD for over 18 years, then on to Rocky Point Park in Rhode Island on the Naraganset Bay. Finally, to Myrtle Beach to Grand Strand Park which later became Family Kingdom. He then opened his own business, a bingo and lounge in Garden City, across from the ocean on Atlantic Avenue and called it Jerry's, which the whole family operated for 14 years. He enjoyed all his customers and friends that he met during those years " great friends and good times. Currently Jerry was back at Family Kingdom. This year, spring called again when the park opened for the summer. He struggled to make it through the 4th of July and finally his body gave out, the end of a chapter, the end of a way of life. Grieve not, nor speak of me with tears, but laugh and talk of me as if I were beside you. I loved you so... Mr. DiCapua is preceded in death by brothers, James, James Thomas and sisters, Elanor and Angelina DiCapua. Survivors include his wife of 59 years, Marie Leake DiCapua; sons,
