Myrtle Beach.... George D. Anderson, age 78, of the Myrtle Beach National Community, passed away Thursday, July 16, 2015 at Grand Strand Regional Medical Center.

Mr. Anderson was born in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, a son of the late Clarence Robert and Dorothy Dinsmore Justice Anderson. In addition to his parents, Mr. Anderson was also preceded in death by a brother, Robert Anderson. Survivors include his wife of 45 years; Rita Anderson; and his sister, Elaine Bendiksen and her husband, Eirik, of Pittsburgh, PA. Mr. Anderson is also survived by four nephews and eight nieces who all live in PA.

Mr. Anderson was a graduate of Carnegie Mellon with a degree in Mechanical Engineering and also received his MBA from California University of Pennsylvania. Prior to his retirement, he was employed for 35 years with Rockwell International and BTR (Senses) in Uniontown and Pittsburgh, PA. Mr. Anderson moved to Myrtle Beach in 1995 and became involved in several community groups. He was a volunteer for Habitat for Humanity of Horry County, SCORE, Conway Medical Center, Carolina Forest Sunrise Rotary Club, and also gave his services to the SouthCreek Homeowners Association. A memorial service will be held at 6:00 PM Wednesday, July 29, 2015 at Goldfinch Funeral Home, Conway Chapel.
