



George B. Dusenbury

July 1, 1921 - April 2, 2017

George Dusenbury, age 95, died on Sunday, April 2, 2017, at Conway Medical Center.

Born in Conway, he was a son of the late Claude and Mildred McCoy Dusenbury. He attended Conway School System until age 16. He saw the war coming, left high school and joined the Navy in 1941, before Pearl Harbor, trained at Norfolk navy base VA , and served 21 years. George's first assignment was on board the USS Prairie, a Destroyer Tender in Philadelphia, PA, then served on 6 other ships as a mothball fleet in Philadelphia Navy Yard PA. He was proud to serve USS Waccamaw (A0109PH Oil Tanker) that runs through Conway, SC. He continued his career with 26 years in Federal Service at the Philadelphia Ship Yard Fire Dept and Fort Dix Fire Dept as a Fire Inspector. His home was in Riverton, NJ with his wife Julia A. Weiss Dusenbury, and 2 daughters Sandre Eichhorn and Carol A. Johnson. After he retired and the death of his wife, he married Natalie (Elms) Dusenbury, and then returned to Surfside Beach, SC. He was preceded in death by his second wife, Natalie; five sisters and a brother. Survivors include his daughters, Sandra and Carol; 3 grandchildren; and a sister, Dorothy Johnson.

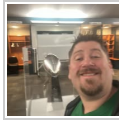

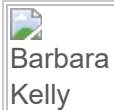
