Conway.....Glenna Elizabeth Moody Hartsock, age 83, beloved wife for 63 years of Robert L. Hartsock of Nottingham Estates Drive died Tuesday, March 18, 2008 at Waccamaw Community Hospital following an illness. \tMrs. Hartsock was born in Cumberland, Maryland, July 6, 1924, a daughter of the late Charles R. and Elizabeth Glenn Moody. She was also predeceased by a brother, John Moody. Mrs. Hartsock graduated from Allegeny High School in Cumberland, Maryland. Prior to retirement, she was employed for 35 years by the now Chamber of Shipping of America in Washington, DC. Mrs. Hartsock enjoyed golfing occasionally. Highlights of her life included a national sorority since 1949, Beta Sigma Phi and one of the elite, senior members of Alpha Omega; several officer positions in the Business and Professional Women, Pendulum Club in Washington, DC for 30 years which was influential in programs for employment of the handicapped in the 1960-1980's and the DC Women's Commission for Crime Prevention; a local television program "Inga's Angle" in the 1950's; and the infamous hole-in-one in 1991 at Heron Point Golf Club in South Carolina during the Women's Grand Strand District Golf Association Tournament. She was an active member of Capitol Hill United Methodist Church in Washington, DC prior to retiring to South Carolina in 1982 to concentrate on golfing. She has been an active member of Centenary United Methodist Church in Conway since 1982, serving in many capacities. \tSurviving are two daughters, Carolyn A. Fonner of Conway and Linda Rivers of Garden City Beach, SC; three grandchildren, Robert M. Rivers of

Fredericksburg, Virginia, Richard J. Rivers of King George, Virginia, and Eric B. Fonner of Hanover Maryland; two great grandchildren, Mason and Sarah Rivers of Fredericksburg, Virginia; three brothers, Richard Moody of Sacramento, California, her twin Chester Moody of Rock Hill, SC, Olin Moody of Cumberland, Maryland; and one sister, Margaret Bucy of La Vale, Maryland; several nieces and nephews; and goddaughter, Kimberly Upchurch of Conway, SC. \tFuneral services will be held at 12:00 Noon Saturday at Centenary United Methodist Church with Rev. Marie Nuckles officiating.
