Atlanta....Henry Deas Richardson Sr., a native of Orangeburg, SC, passed away on Friday November 2, 2012. Henry was born on Feb 27, 1921 in Orangeburg. He graduated from Clemson University in 1945. Upon his graduation he entered into the military and honorably served his country during WWII as a Mechanical Engineer in the United States Army Air Corps. Upon his return from the war, he began his civilian career for the US Postal Service. He served the fine residents of the state of South Carolina as a US Postmaster for Orangeburg, Denmark and several other small towns over his 35 years with the USPS. He was a member of the Church of the Redeemer his entire life and served several years on their Vestry. He was an active Mason until his retirement.
