Jack Hadley Tarner, age 90, died Sunday, November 20, 2011 at Grand Strand Regional Medical Center.

Mr. Tarner was born 1921 in Pittsburgh, PA. He was predeceased by his wife, Sybil C. Tarner, mother, Elsie Sheffield Tarner, father, Scott F. Tarner and a sister, Jean Gallaway. Mr. Tarner was a graduate of Bernards High School, Bernardsville, NJ and the Newark School of Fine and Industrial Arts. He was a U.S. Navy veteran of WWII with service in the Pacific on the aircraft carrier U.S.S. Lexington. He lived many years in Bernardsville and Basking Ridge, NJ.

He retired in 1980 with 30 years of service from the Bell Telephone Laboratories, Murray Hill, NJ as a senior designer, moved to Garden City, S.C. and later to Covenant Towers in Myrtle Beach. Mr. Tarner was a member of the Episcopal Church of the Resurrection in Surfside and Good Shepherd Anglican Church in Myrtle Beach. He was a member of Post 0178 American Legion, and VFW Post 10420, both of Murrells Inlet and a charter member of the Grand Strand Chapter 1167 of the Experimental Aircraft Association. For five years in the mid-80s, Mr. Tarner drew the local editorial cartoon for the Sunday edition of the Sun-News. Surviving are a son, John Scott Tarner of Charles Town, WV; a daughter, Jane Sheffield Tarner of Ranson,

WV; and a granddaughter, Caitlin Caulfield, of Keene, NH.
