James Joseph Corbett, 84, passed peacefully Wednesday, May 18, 2011 at Tideland Hospice House, Georgetown, S.C.

Jim Corbett of Yonkers then Somers, N.Y. lived since 1989 in Myrtle Beach, S.C., a beloved husband/father/grandfather/coach.

Besides his family, he loved the beach, the Yankees and golf -- though it didn't always love him back.

Mr. Corbett was one of the 1947 founders of the Lud-Dale Association South Yonkers youth sports program. He coached Little League baseball 23 years and helped found a St. Denis parish basketball program. Mr. Corbett , employed 31 years by General Motors in Tarrytown, served Westchester/Rockland County youth as a basketball referee/softball umpire in addition to officiating Yonkers Recreation Commission games.

The son of Margaret Reynolds and James A. Corbett, Jim was beloved husband of Joyce Maxwell Corbett for 56 years. He is survived by his wife, three sons and daughters-in-law:

Jim and Cheryl Corbett, Middletown, M.D.; Dr. Jeff and Kim Sammons Corbett, Beverly, MA., grandson, Samm and granddaughter, Maeve; John and Cheryl Adams Corbett, Brewster, N.Y., granddaughter, Carly and grandson, Kyle.

Mr. Corbett was a United States Navy Veteran.
