Stan Cross, age 81, passed away Thursday, January 18, 2024.

Mr. Cross was born in Valdosta, GA a son of the late James Stanton Cross Sr. and the late Lillian Riley Cross. He was a graduate of Conway High School, Class of 1960, as well as a graduate of Clemson University where he remained a longtime supporter. Mr. Cross earned his Juris Doctor degree from the University of South Carolina School of Law. He was an attorney for many years and partnered with the Cross, Singleton, Burroughs, and Norton Law Firm. Mr. Cross was a past member of the SC Bar Association and retired from the law profession as Master of Equity. He was a charter member of Trinity United Methodist Church where he served in various capacities over the years. Most recently he served as the Chairman of the Pastor Parish Relations Committee.

In addition to his parents, Mr. Cross was predeceased by his first wife, Mary Allen Cross.

Survivors include his wife, Martha Holbert Cross of Conway, SC; one daughter, Mary "Catherine" Parypinski (Chris) of Hoschton, GA; one son, James "Jay" Stanton Cross III (Kristie) of Lewisville, NC; two stepdaughters,

Mary Gore Boroff and Callie Anderson Gore both of Myrtle Beach, SC; three grandchildren, Harper Parypinski of Hoschton, GA and Parker Cross and Ansel Cross both of Lewisville, NC; three step grandchildren, Grey Boroff of Nashville, TN, Brennan Davis (Coleman) of Laurens, SC and Alexandra Boroff of Columbia, SC; and two sisters, Kristina Cross Hawkins (Ashley) of Forsythe, GA and Louise Cross Stewart of Macon, GA.

Funeral services will be held at 2:00 PM Tuesday, January 23, 2024 at Trinity United Methodist Church with Rev. Bill McCown officiating. Burial will follow at Hillcrest Cemetery. The family will receive friends one hour prior to the service at the church.

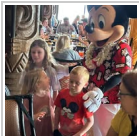
