Myrtle Beach James Curtis Weaver, age 75, of Deerfield Plantation died Wednesday, December 28, 2005 at Grand Strand Regional Medical Center. Born October 23, 1930 in Houston, Mississippi, he was the son of the late William Cortus and Ruby Land Weaver. Mr. Weaver graduated from Houston High School and Mississippi State University with graduate work at Iowa State University. He was a US Army veteran serving in the Korean War. Mr. Weaver retired from American Telephone and Telegraph as a District Manager having worked in Memphis TN, Atlanta, GA, Washington DC, New York and New Jersey. He was active in several Southern Baptist churches as a deacon, Sunday School teacher, building and grounds chairman, etc. He was preceded in death by brothers, Kenneth Rudolph Weaver and Robert Land Weaver. Surviving are his wife, Jewel Patton Weaver; children, Linda Brown and husband Hugh of Myrtle Beach, Gina Seibert and husband Joe of Princeton, NJ and Edward Weaver and wife Tammy of Arlington, VA; grandchildren, Lisa and Andy Brown, Paige and Nicole Weaver.
