James Easterling McLaurin, Jr. - known lovingly to many as Jimbo - passed peacefully on Sunday evening, October 26, 2025, at Waccamaw Hospital in Murrells Inlet, SC. He was 80 years old.

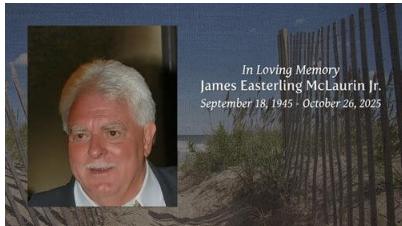

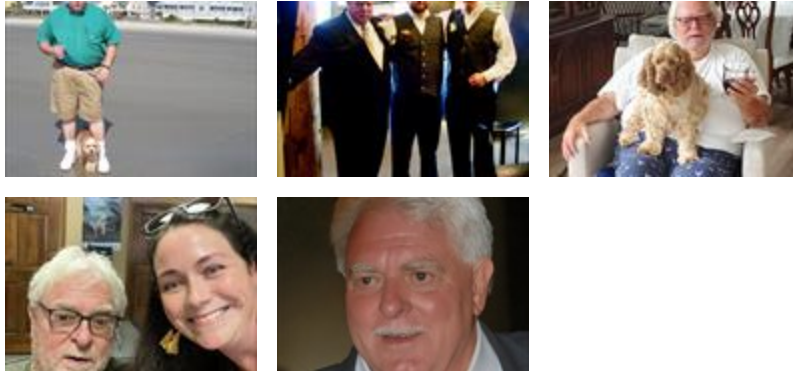
