James Porter Buchanan Sr., 90, of 120 Lakes at Litchfield, Pawleys Island, S.C. passed away on October 5, 2009 at The Lakes of Litchfield. Born on May 7, 1919 in Bristol Virginia, he was the son of the late Hubert Keys Buchanan Sr. and Orion Porter Buchanan. Mr. Buchanan graduated from Bristol Virginia High School and Virginia Polytechnic Institution and State University (Virginia Tech). He was a First Lieutenant in the US Army for 5 years during WWII, serving two and a half years in the China, Burma and India. He helped build the Burma Road, which was one of the most ambitious and difficult engineering feats in human history. After leaving the service, he along with his brother and father owned and operated Home Furniture Company in Bristol, Virginia and Bristol Tennessee. After retirement he moved to Litchfield by the Sea where he lived until moving to The Lakes at Litchfield in 2005. He was a long time member of Litchfield County Club and was an avid golfer for many years. In addition to his parents he was preceded in death by his wife Bille Brown Buchanan, and brothers Hubert Keys Buchanan, sister-in-law Senah Buchanan and Franklin Talmadge Buchanan Sr. He is survived by daughter Ellen Buchanan of Missoula, Montana; son James Buchanan Jr. and fiancÃ© Kyung Noh of Cincinnati, Ohio; daughter Elizabeth Eldridge and husband Joseph from Statesville, North Carolina; and sister-in-law Marjorie Buchanan of Litchfield Beach. He is also survived by 4 grandchildren, Jason and Keenan Whitt, Kiera Lassiter and her husband Geoff, and Spencer Layman and 1 great grandchild, Tess.
