Myrtle Beach: James Robert Chapman died Tuesday, June 3, 2009 at MUSC Hospital in Charleston, SC. Bob was born in Wadesboro, NC on October 29th, 1935, a son of Steven Craig Chapman and Flora Belle Rivers Chapman. He was predeceased by his parents and one brother. He spent his early childhood years in Chesterfield, and then moved to Myrtle Beach, SC with his parents. He attended and graduated from Randolph Macon Military Academy, and later graduated from the Culinary Institute of America. He served in the Army where he was an Honor Graduate of the Quarter Master School. He opened the Sea Captain's House Restaurant in 1963, and successfully operated this Myrtle Beach institution for nearly twenty years. Afterwards, he experimented in various entrepreneurial endeavors and adventures both here and abroad. Lastly, he operated the Chesterfield Inn for several years before retiring. Mr. Chapman believed very strongly in helping those less fortunate & served others in many ways: He was an active member of the First United Methodist Church of Myrtle Beach since 1947, and his activities there included participating in the United Methodist Men's group, the Walk to Emmaus, and a long & devoted history of missionary work, both in the United States and abroad. Bob was a faithful member of the Men's Wednesday Prayer Group and rarely missed a meeting. He was a volunteer at the Community Kitchen and an active volunteer for many years with the local Habitat for Humanity team. These are only a few of the countless ways that he helped others. Bob was known for his wonderful smile, his sense of humor, and for his calming,

peaceful presence, especially in a crisis. He loved simple pleasures like fishing, sailing, good food, and the companionship of animals. He loved to laugh, and never met a stranger. Bob was a devoted husband, father, father-in-law, grandfather and friend. His survivors include his wife, Robin Able Chapman, six children, Julia Chapman Singleton and husband Earl, Steven Craig Chapman III and wife Shelley, Gray Chapman Hayes, William Donald Wright III Billy, James Travis Wright and wife Elizabeth, John Able Wright, seven grandchildren, Albert Earl Singleton III, Hannah Raine Singleton, William Donald Wright IV, Charles Rivers Singleton, Steven Craig Chapman IV, James Gray Singleton and Christopher Gray Chapman, many loved cousins and friends, and his faithful pet Poco. He will be sorely missed by all. A funeral service will be held at 11:00 A.M. Saturday, June 6, 2009 at First United Methodist Church. Burial will follow at Hillcrest Cemetery.
