John Edwin Anderson, 82 of Pawleys Island died Thursday, March 15, 2012 at Waccamaw Community Hospital.

Born in Baltimore, MD, he was the son of the late John and Virginia Anderson. Mr. Anderson was a US Army veteran. He had retired from the Montgomery County, MD Police Dept. where he served as the first president of the F.O.P. He also was a retired foreman of the Plate Printers at the Bureau of Engraving and Printing at the US Department of Treasury. Mr. Anderson was a member of Precious Blood of Christ Catholic Church.
