Mr. John Edward Boisvert, Sr., age 79, passed away on Friday, January 2, 2026 at Conway Medical Center after a long battle with lung disease from exposure to Agent Orange during his time in Vietnam.

Born December 28, 1946 in Lowell, MA, he was the son of the late Edward John Boisvert and Helen Rita Cunningham Boisvert.

Mr. Boisvert attended Keith Academy and following he attended East Coast Aero Tech. He then started working at Four Star Aviation in Lawrence, MA.

Mr. Boisvert proudly served his country in the US Army where he worked as an Air Traffic Controller from 1967-1970. He was assigned to the 322 Aviation Support Detachment for 1st Air Cavalry Division near the Cambodian border in Quan Loi, Vietnam. He also worked Di An Army Base for 1st Infantry Division near Saigon for the 317 Aviation Support Detachment.

After the Army, Mr. Boisvert worked at Boston Air Route Traffic Control Center in Nashua, NH.

Following retirement, he and his wife moved to Conway, SC where they

enjoyed the beach, sunshine, and many wonderful friends. He was also a volunteer driver for the American Cancer Society in the Myrtle Beach area, where he drove sick veterans for their appointments.

Along with his parents, Mr. Boisvert was predeceased by a brother-in-law, Richard Audy.

Surviving are his loving wife of 52 years, Priscille Audy Boisvert; a son, John Edward Boisvert, Jr.; a sister, Janet Galluccio (Mike); brothers-in-law, Robert Audy (Linda), Donald Audy, and Frank Audy (Denise); a sister-in-law, Maureen Audy; many cousins, nieces, and nephews; and close friends, Kevin Cavanaugh, Aaron Stensin, Patsy Wroble, Peter Ricciardi, Tom Brucks and wife, Tom Caruso and wife, and Jerry McCarthy.

A memorial service with Military Honors will be held at 2:00 PM Friday, January 16, 2026 at St. Paul's Anglican Church in Conway with Rev. Jason Collins officiating.

An inurnment will take place at Arlington National Cemetery at a later date.
