



## MSgt. John Benjamin Lawson

Master Sergeant Johnny Benjamin Lawson, age 85, passed away peacefully with his family by his side on Sunday, March 9th, 2025.

Johnny joined the Army on November 11th, 1958, He served with pride for 22 years until being honorably discharged in 1981.
